## Seating plans

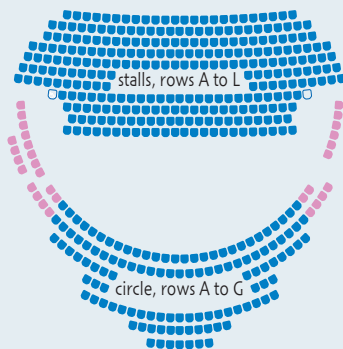
Queen's Theatre stage
