Unaccompanied children of 12 years and over are welcome at most performances (except those with an age guidance limit indicated). Customers must ensure that if children are attending without a parent/guardian that they have safe travel to and from the theatre.

Children aged under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

Access

The following information may prove useful if you have specific access requirements; however it is not exhaustive. Please do contact a member of our team if you have any queries. We are happy to assist.

Physical access

There are wheelchair spaces available in the stalls for every performance at the Queen's Theatre, accessed via a ramp from street level. The Gallery Cafe is situated on the first floor and is accessible by lift.

The Landmark Theatre offers wheelchair spaces for all performances. The Theatre, Pavilion and Rendezvous Café are all fully accessible. There is disabled parking on the Wilder Road car park next to the Landmark at the front of the building.

Both venues have accessible toilet facilities.

If you have a mobility problem, a disability that prevents you from getting out and about or you may not feel safe driving late at night we now have The North Devon Theatres' Minibus Group that covers the Woolacombe, Berrynarbor, Ilfracombe and Combe Martin areas.
