His songs have been covered by many including KD Lang and Natalie Imbruglia, and he was asked to rerecord Bell Book and Candle for a climactic, award winning death scene on TV soap Emmerdale.

Boo has also established a parallel career as Eddi Reader's musical director and guitarist, and has written many songs for and with her.

However, performing live and solo is his real love and this is reflected in his relaxed and charismatic style which is very inclusive of his audience, and makes for an evening not soon forgotten.

#### **Julian Siegel Trio**

Julian Siegel (sax), Greg Cohn (bass), Joey Baron (drums)

Julian has quickly established himself as both a remarkable writer and a powerful player in the UK and Europe, with his debut album Close-up creating quite a stir. In 2007 he was awarded the BBC Jazz Award for Best Instrumentalist and has toured with some major artists including Hermeto Pascoal and Andrew Hill and continues to be involved with the most influential British jazz groups today.

This trio originally came together as a Cheltenham International Jazz Festival commission, but has developed into a real meeting of musical minds. Siegel and the ace downtown New York rhythm section of Greg Cohen and Joey Baron create real fireworks and provide a perfect setting for fresh improvisations and great dialogue between the musicians. Their latest CD Live at the Vortex was released in November 08.

Damon works throughout Europe, with Killer Shrimp (with Ed Jones) and as a side man with jazz greats Benny Golson , Dave Liebman and Doug Rainey.


#### Chris Sherburn & Denny Bartley

There are wheelchair spaces available in the stalls for every performance at the Queen's Theatre. accessed via a ramp from street level. The Gallery Cafe is situated on the first floor and is accessible by lift.

The Landmark Theatre offers wheelchair spaces for all performances. The Theatre, Pavilion and Rendezvous Café are all fully accessible. There is disabled parking on the Wilder Road car park

next to the Landmark at the front of the building.

Both venues have accessible toilet facilities.

#### Minibus aroup

If you have a mobility problem, a disability that prevents you from getting out and about or if you do not feel safe driving at night, we now have the North Devon Theatres' Minibus Group. This service is able to pick you up from your home and take you to either the Queen's or Landmark Theatre to see the shows of your choice.

Covering the Woolacombe, Ilfracombe, Combe Martin and Berrynarbor areas, for a small fee, the Ilfracombe **Community Transport** bus will get you there; see the bus logo on the relevant shows. This season we are hoping to extend the service to include Barnstaple and Bideford.
