When Polish pianist Wasilewski, at just 16, got a call from Poland's international jazz star, trumpeter Tomasz Stanko, little did he know that it would change his life. The trio recorded their first CD with Stanko in 2001 and have now justifiably gained an international stature of their own, with two ECM releases, the latest simply titled Trio. With eclectic musical tastes that include New Cinematic Orchestra, the CD mixes original compositions with tunes from Bjork (Hyperballad) and Wayne Shorter (Plaza Real), combining a strongly lyrical sense and more exploratory collective improvisations. Stand-by tickets

Any remaining unsold seats may be purchased for half the top price either by phone or in person after 6pm on the day of performance. Tickets must be paid for at time of booking. This offer is not available on all shows.

Young people admissions policy

Infants aged 18 months or under may be held on their parent or guardian's lap with no charge. In the interest of all our customers an infant must remain on the accompanying adult's lap at all times throughout the performance.

The infant in arms ticket is available for pantomime and all children's events.

Unaccompanied children

Unaccompanied children of 12 years and over are welcome at most performances (except those with an age guidance limit indicated). Customers must ensure that if children are attending without a parent/guardian that they have safe travel to and from the theatre.

The Landmark Theatre offers wheelchair spaces for all performances. The Theatre, Pavilion and Rendezvous Café are all fully accessible. There is disabled parking on the Wilder Road car park next to the Landmark at the front of the building.

Both venues have accessible toilet facilities.

Minibus group 🚍

If you have a mobility problem, a disability that prevents you from getting out and about or if you do not feel safe driving at night, we now have the North Devon Theatres' Minibus Group. This service is able to pick you up from your home and take you to either the Queen's or Landmark Theatre to see the shows of your choice.

Covering the Woolacombe, Ilfracombe, Combe Martin and Berrynarbor areas, for a small fee, the Ilfracombe Community Transport bus will get you there; see the bus logo on the relevant shows. This season we are hoping to extend the service to include Barnstaple and Bideford.
